MATERIAL-SUBJECT-WORD

TIPS FOR IMPLEMENTING

- Print out the lists.
- Cut them up and put them in separate jars, label them with the topic (material, subject, or word).
- Optional: add the instructions below the title on the jar to help students understand how to use their selection.

VISUAL JOURNALS:

- Pick 3: Randomly select one slip per jar. Use the material as the primary material in their visual journal. They can use other materials, but they should focus on this. Subject should guide the content of the page. The word can be included in the design or guide the design.
- Pick 2: Randomly select a material slip + subject or material slip + word.
- Pick 1: Randomly select a slip from material, subject, or word.

SKETCHBOOK:

- Have students select a slip from the subject or word jar to inspire a sketchbook page.

MATERIAL-SUBJECT-WORD

ACTIVITY

SUPPLIES:

The supplies will vary based on the material you choose from the material jar.

- Work of art, Sketchbook, or visual journal
- Scissors
- Glue
- Collage materials: Magazines, scrapbook paper, fabric, lace, wrapping paper, maps, bleeding tissue paper, old books
- Drawing materials: Sharpies, colored pencils, pencils, pens, paint pens, pastels, oil pastels, crayons, charcoal, watercolor pencils
- Painting materials: Tempera paint, acrylic paint, watercolor, India ink, gesso, paintbrushes, water, water cups
- Unusual materials: coffee grounds, tea bags, stencils, stamps, cardboard, botanicals (leaves, flowers, and similar), masking tape, packaging tape, Washi tape
- Access to a computer or printer to print images

ACTIVITY:

- Randomly select one slip from the materials jar. *If you don't have access to the material*
