



Teacher Notes

This quick painting project is great for Kindergarten as well as older students! Older students can add a wrought iron fence to complete the landscape.

- Test project with your supplies to see how quickly the yellow paint dries. If it dries too quickly for the blue to mix some when applied, instruct your students to finish the tree top before adding paint on the ground or make smaller trees (quarter sheet vs half sheet of Additional yellow paint can always be added on top of blue dots if necessary.

- I put paint in the middle of disposable plates, then add the needed number of Q-tips CLASSROOM MANAGEMENT:
 - This makes it easier to distribute as students finish drawing their tree trunk.
 - I wait to distribute blue paint plates with Q-tips until the students are ready to use it. or if the yellow paint begins to turn green with Kindergarteners using it. You


