STEP FOUR: A lightbulb is a 3-D shape.



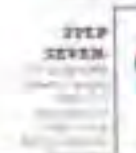
STEP FIVE: A hot air balloon is a 3-D shape.

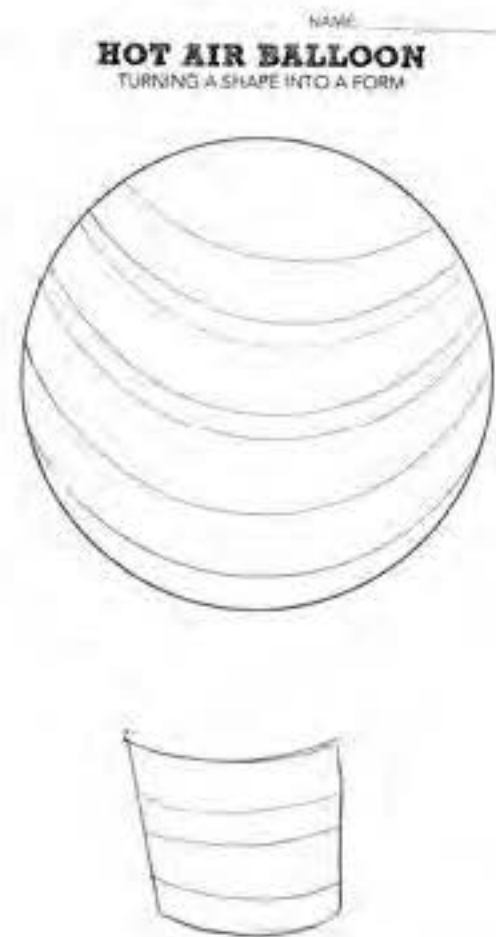
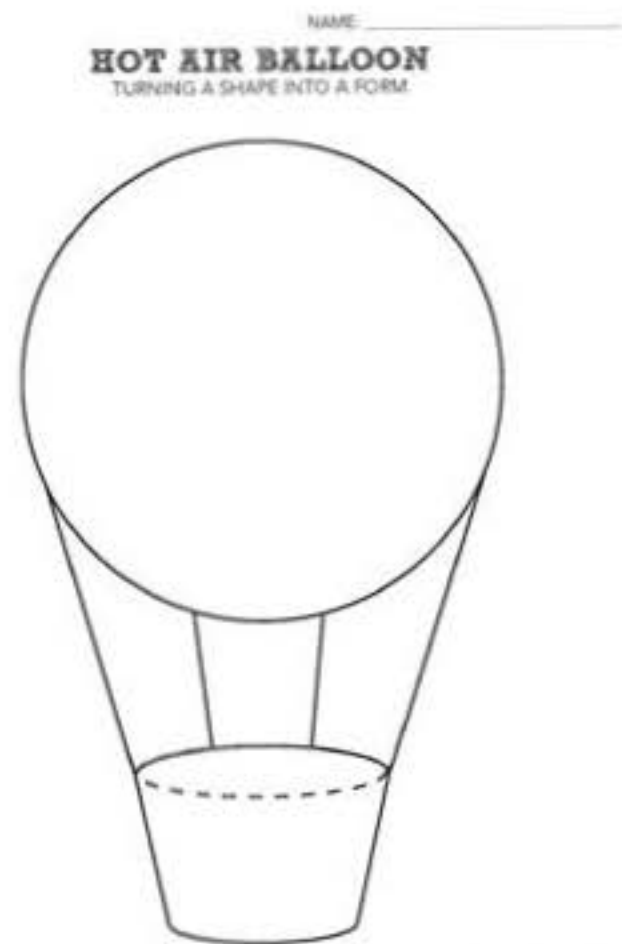
IMPLEMENTATION:

DAY 1: Project Introduction

- When students arrive, gather them at the front of the room or have them sit quietly at their seats. *TIP: wait to pass out supplies or leave supplies in the corner of the table to*

HOW TO GUIDE

Manufacture of vertical string form to be the steps below



STEP ONE: Cut a 10cm circle from paper



STEP TWO: Add a vertical line down the center



STEP THREE: Add two curved lines connected by a straight line to form a basket



STEP FOUR: Use a marker to draw patterns on the balloon



STEP FIVE: Add a basket and color to form the balloon and basket patterns



STEP SIX: Color in the balloon and basket patterns and add a person and a dog to your basket if you wish



OPTIONAL: Use a marker to draw patterns on the balloon and basket

STEP SEVEN: Use a marker to draw patterns on the balloon and basket



STEP EIGHT: Cut out your hot air balloon and basket
