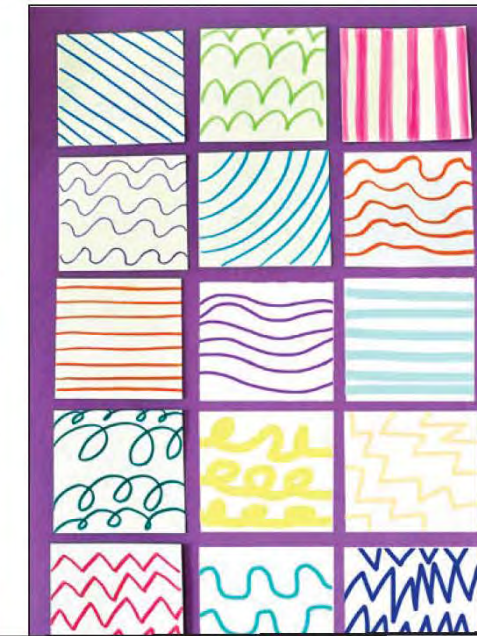

EXPLORING LINE

HOW TO GUIDE

Create a line quilt by decorating a square with lines and adding it to the quilt design.

STEP ONE: Get a square piece of paper, place it on a piece of scratch paper.

STEP TWO: Pick your favorite colour and your favorite line. Draw it on the paper.

STEP THREE: Fill up your piece of paper with lines. Have the lines go off the edges of the paper.

HOW TO GUIDE

LINE MUSTACHE Try creating a mustache using pipe cleaner lines.

STEP ONE: Test out different line styles using pipe cleaners.

STEP TWO: Pick your favorite line to turn into a mustache.

STEP THREE: Attach another pipe cleaner by wrapping it around the center of your mustache line. Test out your new mustache!

LINE SNAIL Try creating a snail using pipe cleaners to create lines.

- 1: A blue pipe cleaner bent into a vertical line.
- 2: A blue pipe cleaner bent into a spiral shape.
- 3: A blue pipe cleaner bent into a snail-like shape.
- 4: A blue pipe cleaner bent into a snail-like shape with a shell.

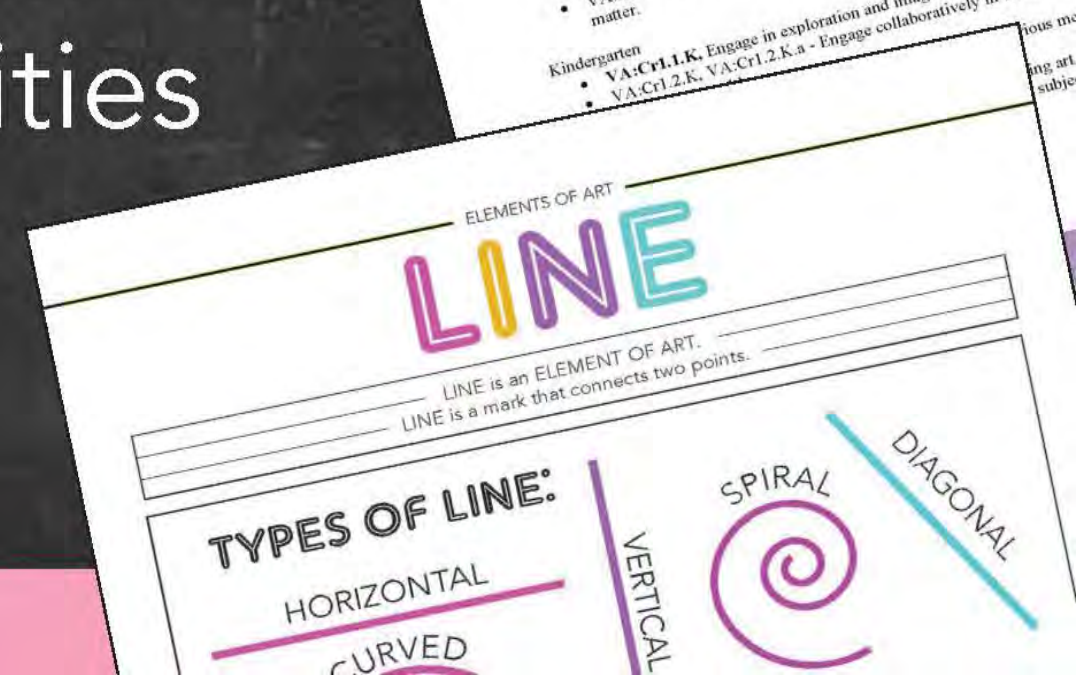
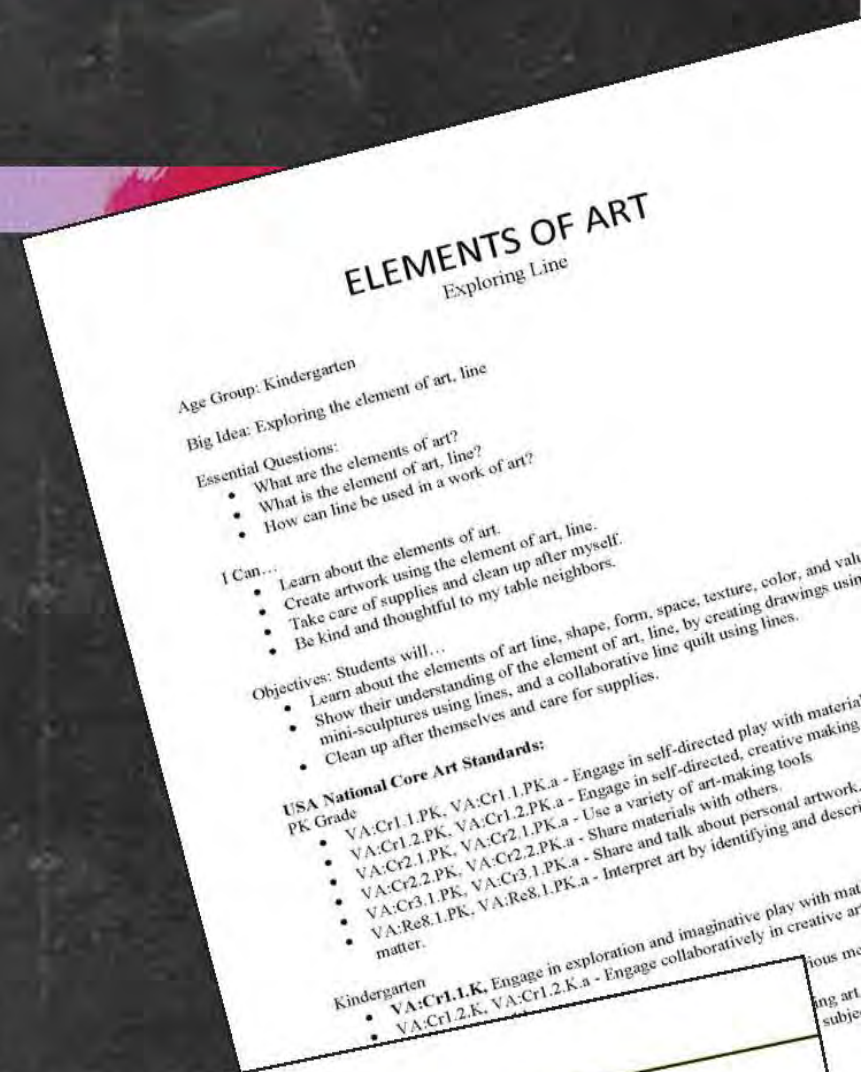

Age Group: Kindergarten

Big Idea: Exploring the element of art, line

Essential Questions:

- What are the elements of art?
- What is the element of art, line?
- How can line be used in a work of art?

I Can...

- Learn about the elements of art.
- Create artwork using the element of art, line.
- Take care of supplies and clean up after myself.
- Be kind and thoughtful to my table neighbors.

Objectives: Students will...

- Learn about the elements of art line, shape, form, space, texture, color, and value.
- Show their understanding of the element of art, line, by creating drawings using lines, mini-sculptures using lines, and a collaborative line quilt using lines.

TEACHER NOTES

KINDER ELEMENTS OF ART UNIT

- This is a great second week of school activity after you have assigned seats and explained classroom procedures the first week of school.
- After this activity try to highlight other elements of art in the following weeks.

LINE QUILT:

- Cut squares in a size that allows the entire class of squares to fit on one sheet of construction paper with narrow spaces between each.
- Squares can be turned to make multiples of the same lines look different and add variety to the quilt.
- Line Quilts are great to fill spaces and bulletin boards in the art room and around the school the second week of school when other finished projects are scarce!
- Call the quietest table up to the line quilt table first. This will encourage good behavior in the other tables.

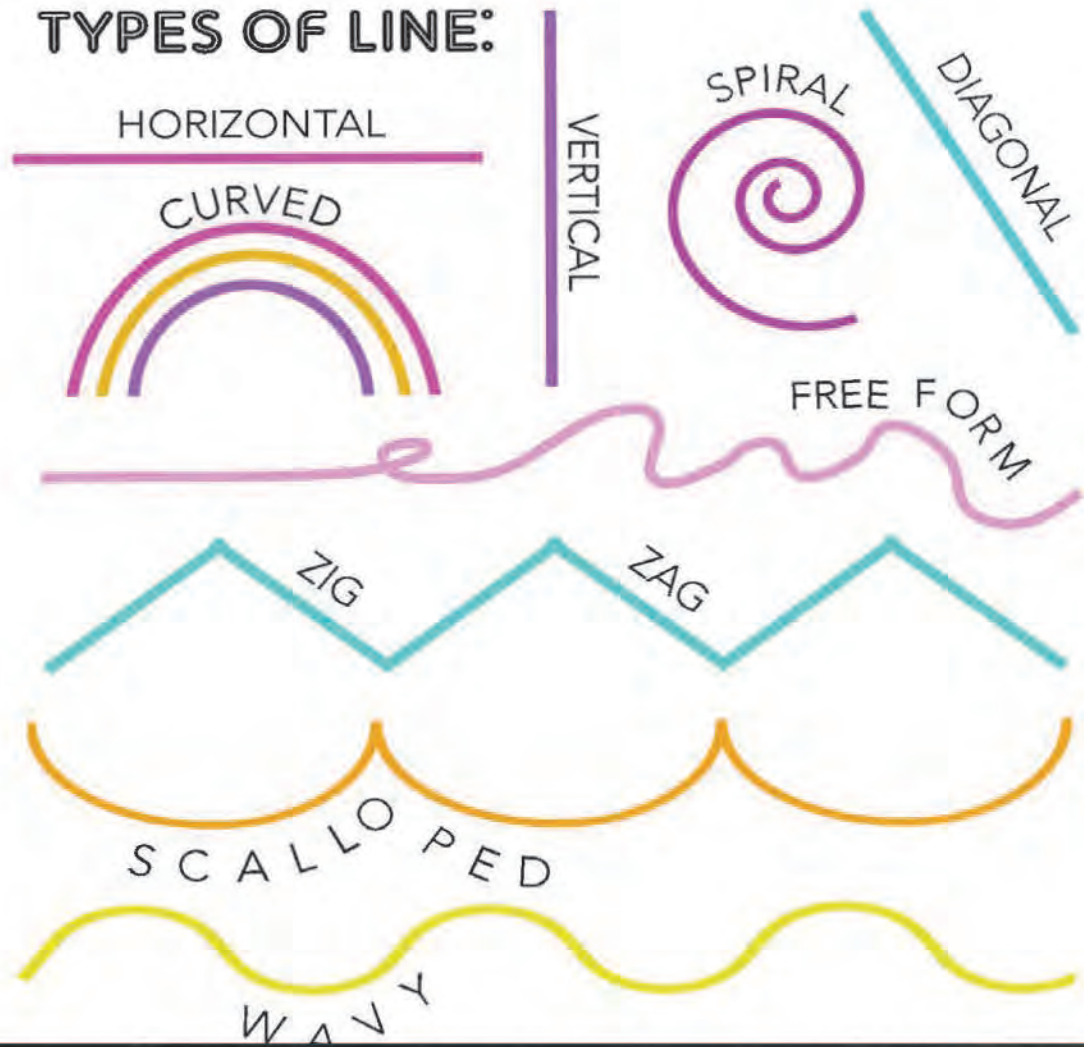
LINE ACTIVITIES:

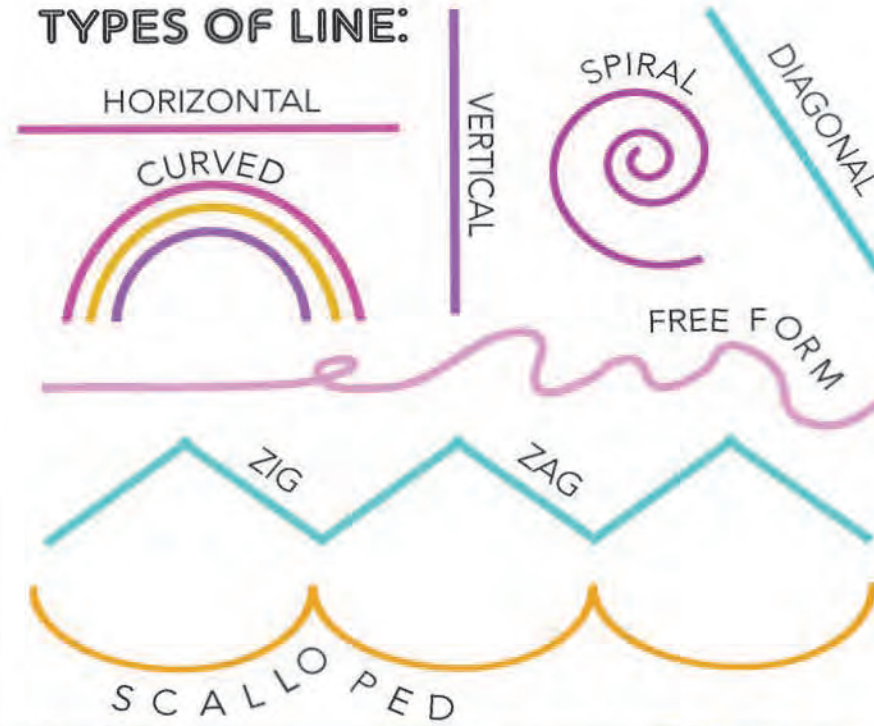

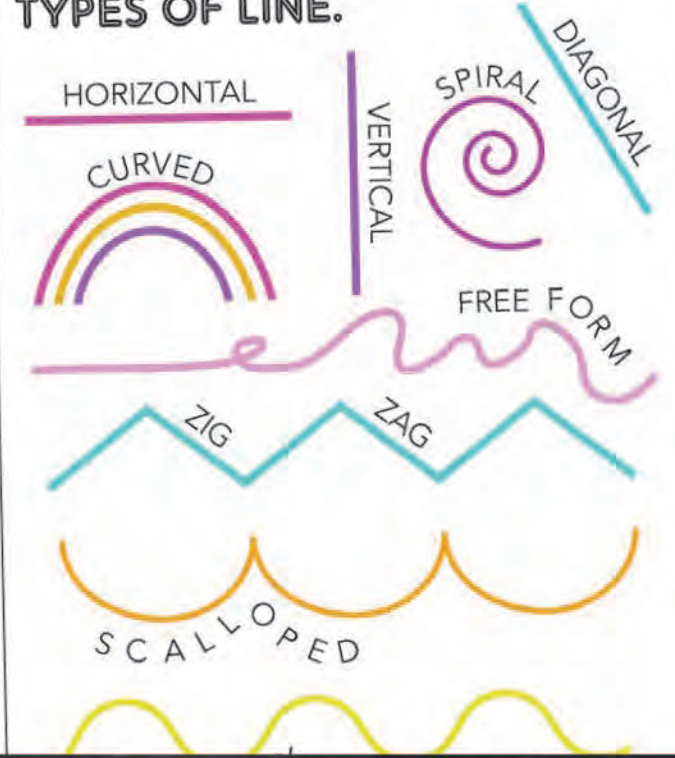

Elements of art are the basics of a work of art that come together to create it.

The elements of art include:

- Line
- Shape
- Color
- Value
- Space
- Form
- Texture

ELEMENTS OF ART

LINE

Line is a mark that is longer than it is wide.

Types of line include:

- Horizontal
- Vertical
- Diagonal
- Curved
- and so many more!

Today:

- You will experiment with lines!
- You will draw lines.
- You will create line sculptures
- You will create a collaborative work of art, a line quilt!

Step 1:

- Use string or chains to practice line styles.
- What lines can you create?

Step 2:

- Try making lines using pipe cleaners.
- Wrap a pipe cleaner around your finger to create a spiral turning it into a form, or a 3D work of art.
- Pick your favorite pipe cleaner line to turn into a mustache!

Step 3:

- Fold a pipe cleaner in half.
- Roll it into a spiral.
- Wrap another pipe cleaner around the middle.
- Wait for help to add googly eyes.
- You've create a snail sculpture using lines!

Step 4

- Create line designs on a blank sheet of paper.

EXPLORING LINE

HOW TO GUIDE

Try out different lines using different materials. Follow the steps below.



STEP ONE: Try using string or a chain to create different styles of line. Test straight, curvy, loopy, zig zag, and more!



STEP TWO: Try making different lines using pipe cleaners. Try making a coil by wrapping a pipe cleaner around your finger. It turns the line 3D!



STEP THREE: Get a sheet of paper, markers, crayons, or coloured pencils.



STEP FOUR: Try drawing different types of lines. Look at your pipe cleaner lines for inspiration.

Create lines using string or chains, pipe cleaners, and create a line design drawing

HOW TO GUIDE

LINE MUSTACHE

Try creating a mustache using pipe cleaner lines.



STEP ONE: Test out different line styles using pipe cleaners.



STEP TWO: Pick your favorite line to turn into a mustache.



STEP THREE: Attach another pipe cleaner by wrapping it around the center of your mustache line. Test out your new mustache!

LINE SNAIL

Try creating a snail using pipe cleaners to create lines.



STEP ONE: Get a pipe cleaner and fold it in half.



STEP TWO: Roll the end of the pipe cleaner into a spiral line.

STEP THREE: Attach another pipe cleaner by wrapping it next to the spiral.



STEP FOUR: Get help from your teacher to hot glue a googly eye on the top of each antennae. Enjoy your pipe cleaner snail!
