**STEP FIVE:** Erase lines you don't need and add details.

## Teacher Notes

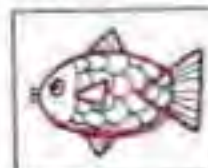


# DRAW USING SHAPES

HOW TO GUIDE

Use the shapes in the boxes below to draw the shape in a picture with the object.

STEP ONE: Look at the object (fish) and draw it.



STEP TWO: Draw the shape of the object with a thin marker.

STEP THREE: In the first square draw the shapes with a pencil.

STEP FOUR: Move the shapes together with an eraser.

STEP FIVE: Trace the shape you drew and add colour.
