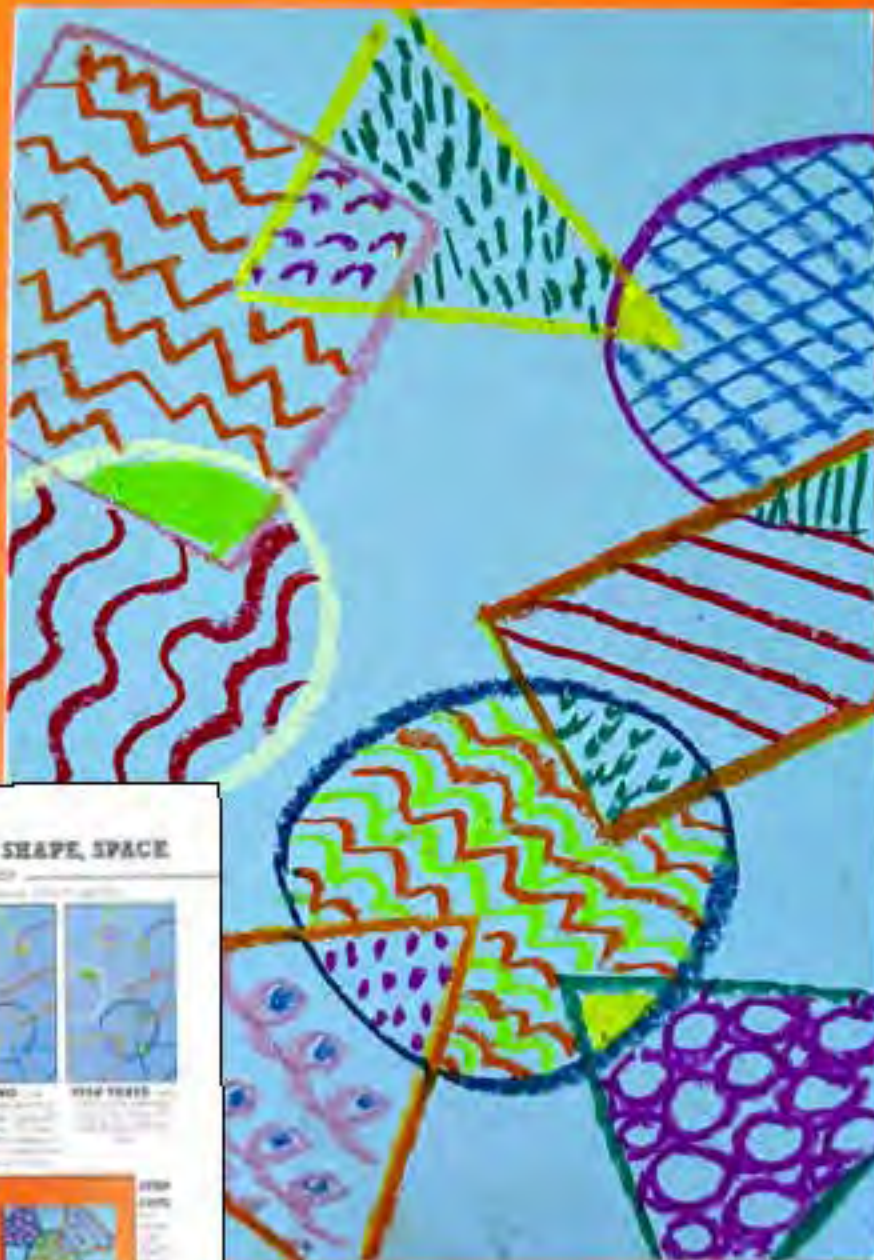

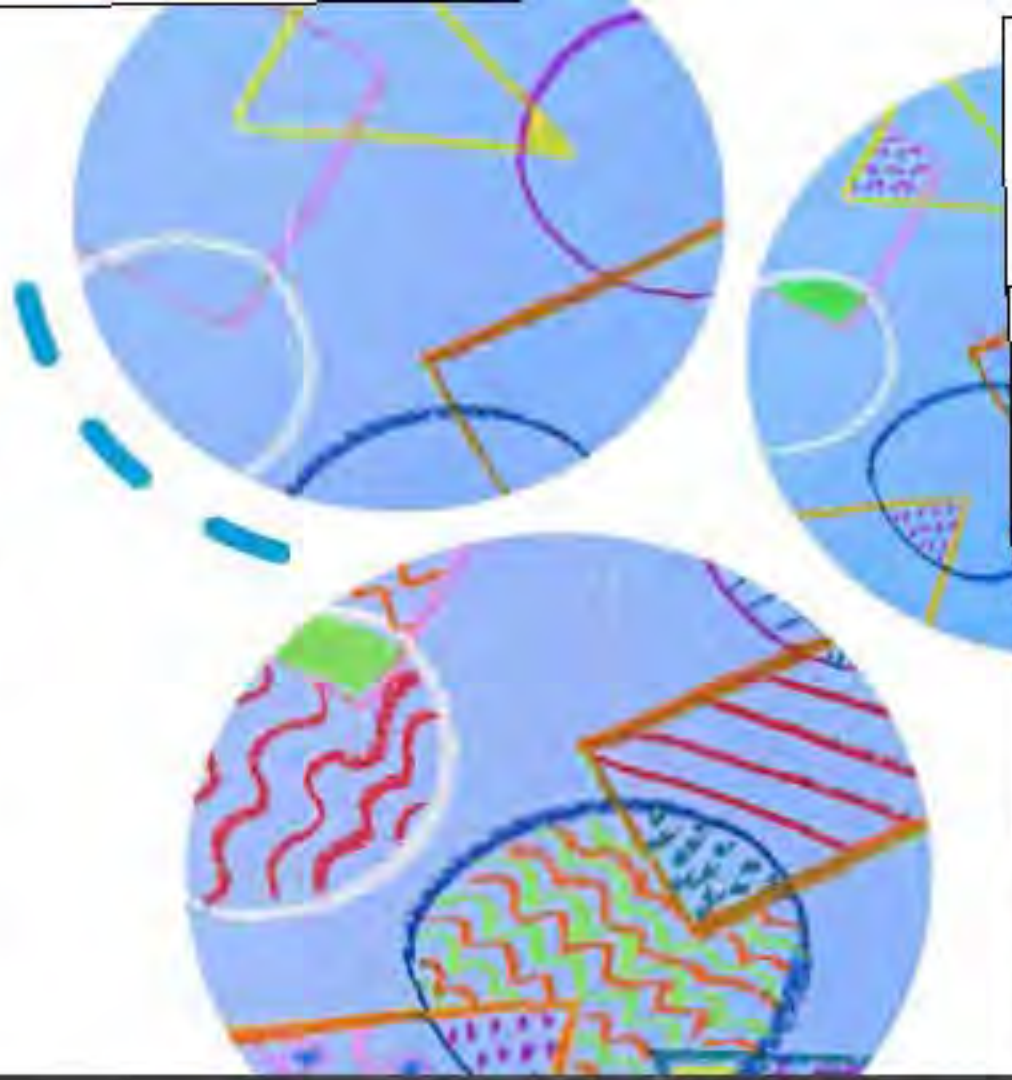
- This single lesson project is great for reviewing line, shape, and space. It serves as a foundation for adding the understanding and use of geometric shapes and positive and negative space.

- ❑ Test shapes and lines on the back of your paper or scrap paper.
- ❑ Draw geometric shapes that overlap.
- ❑ Fill the space by having shapes go off the edge, create interesting positive space with overlapping shapes and negative space between the shapes.
- ❑ Add different color lines in each positive space.
- ❑ Pick a color construction paper to mount your paper on.

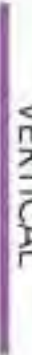
