





ELEMENTS OF ART REVIEW LINE, SHAPE, SPACE CHECKLIST

Selected a color construction paper to create their design.
Drew overlapping geometric shapes.
No more than 3 shapes overlap a single shape.
Interesting positive space is created by overlapping shapes. Interesting negative space is created by the shapes filling the space.
Shapes go off all four edges of the paper. Shapes are the same size or larger than their fist.
Shapes are the same size of the fill every positive space shape







