Big Idea Exploring warm and cool colors

Essential Questions:

- What are warm colors?
- What are cool colors?
- What is a mixed media work of art?

Objectives: Students will ...

- Listen to the book, The Scarecrow, written by Beth Ferry and illustrated by the Fan
- Learn about warm and cool colors.
- Use crayons to draw a one-of-a-kind scarecrow and solidly color their drawing.
- Add cool watercolor over their scarcerow drawing to create a cool color background.
- Create a warm or cool color design as an early finisher activity sing quather segrectory as an early finisher activity

- Scaffolding option: before beginning this project complete a pattern focused project, such as a snake design, and apply this knowledge by adding pattern to the scarecrow's clothing

Project Tips:

- I usually use larger size drawing paper for the scarecrows. If their drawing ends up small the edges can be trimmed down for a stronger composition.
- I usually put brushes in wide bowls (they don't tip as easily) just before students paint and tell them to return them to the bowl after painting. This cuts down on
- Only cover the bottom of the bowl with paint to prevent brushes from getting too saturated, refill as needed while students are working.
